

MIDAMERICA PRODUCTIONS GENERAL RESIDENCY SCHEDULE

The following is a summary of a typical five-day/four-night New York residency with MidAmerica Productions. It contains guidelines on activities and general times for your information; however, each residency is arranged and scheduled separately based on the type of concert and availability.

THE FIRST DAY is occupied by travel and check-in at the hotel. The balance of the day is usually free.

THE SECOND AND THIRD DAYS generally contain one rehearsal each day, in either the morning or the afternoon. The evenings are free.

ON THE FOURTH DAY the concert occurs. The dress rehearsal usually occurs in the concert hall on this same day. Following the concert, groups are treated to a special post-concert cruise around lower Manhattan with music for dancing and a buffet supper.

THE FIFTH DAY groups return home.

During your free time you may:

- use your coupon at Macy's;
- use your coupon for the Empire State Building;
- plan other activities in New York.*
